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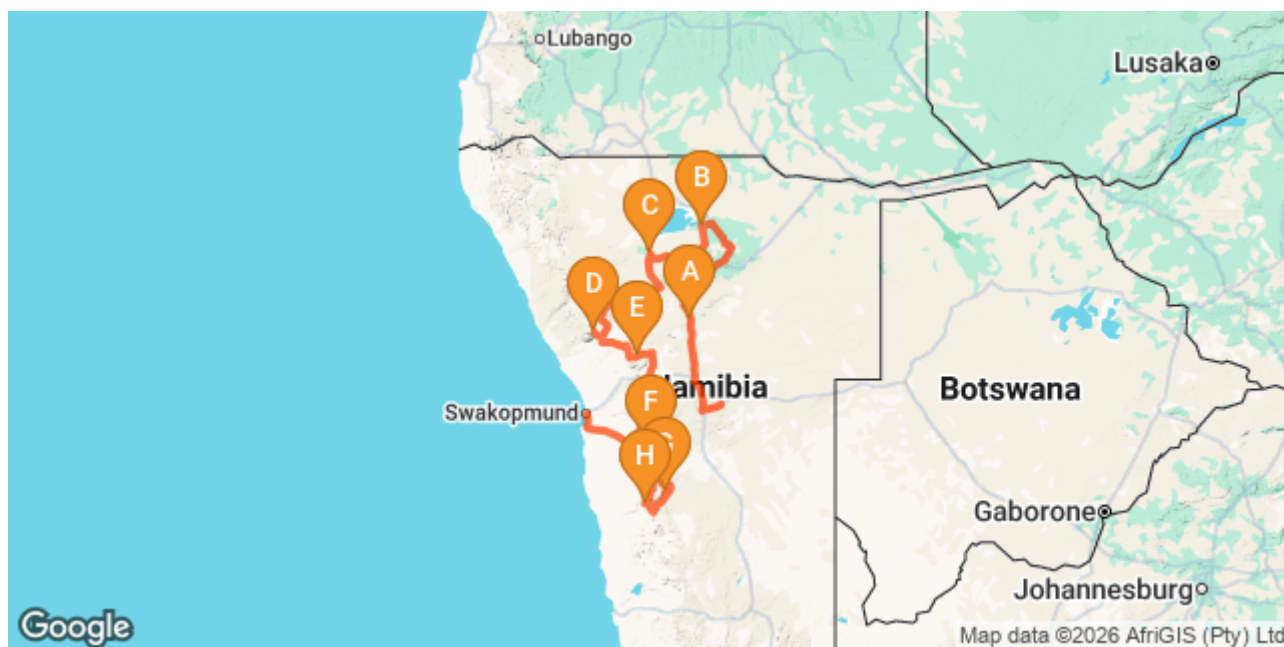

Day 1: The Otjiwa Collection Campsites, Otjiwa Reserve (Mon, 8 March)

Day Itinerary

The clients will be met by their guide at the international airport outside Windhoek. The clients will have time to do some shopping on arrival for drinks and snacks for the next couple of days, although they will have points along the route each day to buy more. Upon arrival at the lodge the clients will have time with their guide to setup camp and get acquainted with how to setup camp. Depending on the arrival time the clients can book a optional game drive with the lodge, go for a hike, guided E-bike trail or Horse back riding. Dinner will be prepared by your guide at the campsite.

Namibia

Located in southwestern Africa, Namibia boasts a well-developed infrastructure, some of the best tourist facilities in Africa, and an impressive list of breathtaking natural wonders. Visitors can explore the capital of Windhoek and discover the lovely coastal town of Swakopmund, which boasts remnants of the country's German influence, reflected in its architecture, culture, cuisine, and the annual Oktoberfest celebrations. To properly appreciate this extraordinary country, you will have to venture out of the cities to explore the remarkable natural landscapes

Namibia has to offer. These include: the impressive Fish River Canyon; the vast Etosha National Park teeming with abundant wildlife, such as lions, desert-adapted elephants and the Hartmann's Mountain Zebra; the hauntingly beautiful Kalahari Desert; and, ofcourse, the Namib Desert stretching for over 2000 km along the magnificent Atlantic Coast. Namibia is an ideal destination for travellers seeking an unforgettable African experience in a uniquely beautiful, untamed wilderness.

Otjiwa Reserve

Set in the heart of Namibia's Otjozondjupa region, Otjiwa Game Reserve spans 12,000 hectares of open bushveld, rolling plains and acacia-studded savanna. The reserve exudes a serene and private atmosphere, where wildlife roams freely, and the horizon stretches unbroken beneath vast African skies. Visitors can embark on guided game drives to spot giraffe, zebra, antelope and rhino, or enjoy walking safaris that reveal the subtle rhythms of the bush. At sunrise, the air carries the scent of dry grass and earth, while the calls of birds and distant wildlife punctuate the quiet, a place where Namibia's wild beauty is both immersive and unforgettable.

Overnight: The Otjiwa Collection Campsites

Located within the Otjiwa Wildlife Sanctuary in central Namibia, The Otjiwa Collection Campsites offer a peaceful setting surrounded by natural beauty. Guests can easily explore nearby attractions such as the Waterberg Plateau and the vibrant town of Otjiwarongo. Campsites provide practical amenities including a water basin, clean river-sand surface, washing area, fireplace, and optional electrical points. Visitors can enjoy self-catering or savour local cuisine at nearby restaurants. The campsite area features two well-maintained ablution blocks with hot water, separate facilities for men and women, and spacious plots accommodating up to three cars and three tents.

Day 2: Onguma Tamboti Campsite, Onguma Nature Reserve (Tue, 9 March)

Day Itinerary

After breakfast we break up camp and make our way towards Etosha. Depending on your departure time there might be time to do a optional Rhino tracking activity with the lodge, your guide will advise if time allows for this. Upon arrival at Onguma Private reserve we will setup camp. Depending on the time the clients can do a game drive in Etosha Park with their guide and tour vehicle. Optionally the clients can book a game drive with the lodge on the private reserve. All meals prepared by your guide.

Onguma Nature Reserve

Situated east of Etosha, bordering Fisher's Pan, Onguma Game Reserve is one of Namibia's best-kept secrets. The reserve offers visitors the opportunity to experience Africa in all her beauty and diversity. Onguma Game Reserve features over 35 480 hectares of protected land scattered with a variety of wildlife including plains game, black rhino, kudu, giraffe, zebra, lion, cheetah, leopard and more than 300 bird species. The seasonal rains attract thousands of migrating birds to the Fisher's Pan wetland area. The neighbouring Etosha National Park is home to a rich array of wildlife, including 4 of the Big 5. Visitors can enjoy game drives, guided walks and rhino research drives within the private reserve as well as wildlife safaris into Etosha National Park to view abundant game in the largest national park in Namibia.

Overnight: Onguma Tamboti Campsite

Adventure seekers are drawn to Namibia's wide open spaces. Onguma Nature Reserve offers the opportunity to camp in style at the fenced Onguma Tamboti Campsite, with 25 camping sites nestled in the trees.

There is a stunning main area with complimentary Wi-Fi and a restaurant where guests can enjoy a hearty meal while looking out across the waterhole, or relax by the pool with views of the bush. The supply store stocks essentials and the deep verandas ensure there is shade to relax in.

Each site feels private, complete with private ablution facility with spacious shower room, separate toilet and covered washing-up areas with lots of space to unpack and organize. There is also ample plugs to ensure cooler boxes remain cool and cameras get charged.

Guests can explore Etosha National Park on their own, or join a guided safari into the park with one of our experienced guides.



Camping Sites

Onguma Tamboti Campsite consists of 25 camping sites within a fenced area. Tucked into the Namibian bush, each camping site has its own fire-place, power point, kitchen wash-up area and individual ablutions (shower, toilet and basin).

Day 4: Etosha Safari Campsite Gondwana Collection Namibia, Etosha South (Thu, 11 March)

Day Itinerary

After breakfast and breaking up the camp and make our way through Etosha from east to central south. We will be doing a game drive the whole way while crossing and visit multiple water holes and see what we can find. Upon arriving at our next camp just outside Etosha park we will setup camp. The clients will have time to relax and enjoy the pool and cocktails afterwards. All meals prepared by your guide.

Etosha South

Situated along the southern boundary of Etosha National Park in northwestern Namibia, Etosha South encompasses the park's southern safari region and a collection of private game reserves and lodges. The park is accessed via Andersson Gate, placing visitors within easy reach of renowned waterholes and excellent wildlife viewing. Lions, elephants, giraffes, white and black rhinos, and a wide variety of antelope are among the species commonly seen. Guided 4x4 game drives are the main attraction, with half- and full-day safaris available, some including picnic lunches in the bush.

Overnight: Etosha Safari Campsite Gondwana Collection Namibia

Set up under Mopane trees with loving care, this campsite offers guests many shady spots covered with lawn. Apart from showers, toilets and sink units there are several power points all over the site as well as mobile grills. Camping guests are welcome to use the swimming pool of neighbouring Etosha Safari Camp (a two minutes' walk). And those who want to treat themselves to dinner after an exciting day are most welcome at the camp's Okambashu restaurant. The Oshebeena bar next-door, decorated in typical township style, is just the place for a little get-together in the midst of African joie de vivre. Only 10 km away from Andersson gate, the camping site is the ideal basis for safari excursions into Etosha National Park.

Location: 10 km south of Andersson Gate on the C 38 (Etosha National Park).

Day 5: Brandberg White Lady Camping, Brandberg (Fri, 12 March)

Day Itinerary

After breakfast and breaking up camp we make our way to Damaraland. On arrival at our next camp we will setup camp right next to the Ugab River. The lodge depending on the time your guide can do a nature drive with you to look for the elusive desert adapted elephants. If time does not allow this can be done the next morning or can be done twice (afternoon and morning) , your guide will advice what looks best. The clients can enjoy the lodge pool and try their luck at the golf driving range while they have the view of Brandberg in front of them. All meals prepared by your guide.

Brandberg

Situated in northwestern Namibia, the Brandberg, meaning 'Fire Mountain', Massif is Namibia's highest peak, at its zenith, the Königstein (King's Stone), standing at a whopping 2573 metres above sea level. Named for the vivid shade of orange it sometimes turns at sunset, this is undoubtedly the main highlight of the region. The Brandberg has been sacred to the San people for centuries. The Tsisab Ravine at its base is permeated with over 45 000 ancient San rock paintings, including the famous 'White Lady'. Visitors flock here to view this unique bushman painting, said to be over 2000 years old. Other popular drawcards include its untouched natural beauty and its free-roaming wildlife such as mountain zebra, kudu, springbok, and desert elephant.

After breakfast and breaking up camp the clients can optionally visit the famous White Lady hiking trail for a guided hike to see the famous Bushman painting. Entrance fees are payable at the start of the hike and the clients will get a local guide to take them to the paintings. This hike goes into the famous Brandberg and is a beauty on its own. Afterwards we make our way to our next campsite via the town of Uis. Upon arriving we will setup camp and the

clients will have time to relax and take in the beauty of the Erongo mountain. This area is known for amazing sundowners and we recommend you take advantage of that. All meals prepared by your guide.

Erongo Mountains

Situated in central-western Namibia between the towns of Omaruru and Usakos, the Erongo Mountains are a striking granite mountain range renowned for their dramatic rock formations, ancient San rock art and diverse wildlife. Formed by an extinct volcano, the region offers scenic hiking trails that wind through massive boulders, rugged valleys and distinctive granite peaks. Visitors can explore prehistoric rock art sites, enjoy guided nature walks, birdwatching and game drives, with opportunities to spot species such as klipspringer, kudu, zebra and numerous birds. Towering granite domes, golden grasslands and spectacular sunsets create an unforgettable sense of wilderness, making the Erongo Mountains an ideal destination for travellers seeking natural beauty, cultural heritage and outdoor adventure.

Day 8: Namibs Valley Lodge, Gamsberg (Mon, 15 March)

Day Itinerary

After breakfast and packing up camp we make our way to the next campsite known for its amazing views and other worldly landscapes. On arrival the clients setup camp and have the rest of the day to do some hiking or just relax by

the pool. This area is known for its stargazing and the clients can try their hand at Star photography. All meals prepared by your guide.

Gamsberg

Lying east of the Namib-Naukluft Desert, in Central Namibia, the Gamsberg area is home to the majestic Gamsberg Mountain, dubbed Namibia's 'table mountain'. This area is a mecca for 4x4 enthusiasts, who tackle the steep Gamsberg Pass, a gravel road cutting through the rugged terrain. It is Namibia's highest, longest and most scenic pass overlooking the beautiful Kuiseb River in the valley below. Visitors can enjoy superb stargazing opportunities as there is no light pollution, hike along the trails traversing the Gamsberg Mountain, which stands at an impressive elevation of 2347 metres above sea level; and explore the Gamsberg Nature Reserve, home to indigenous plant life and a variety of wildlife.

Overnight: Namibs Valley Lodge

Perched on a hilltop, over-looking the expansive views of the Gaub Valley, Namib's Valley Lodge allows you to drink in the panoramic views in every direction, as far as the eye can see.

The valley is dotted with thousands of hills creating a photographer's paradise. This natural scenery creates a fairy tale feel to a place otherwise known for its dry and arid conditions.

Namibs Valley Lodge is situated in the vast desert plains of Namib Naukluft on the route to the mighty Sossusvlei dunes or Walvis Bay and 180 km from Windhoek. Located amid magnificent planes of the south-west Namibian landscape, it is an ideal gateway to explore the Namib and make the most of your unique Namibian experience.

Until the lodge was built here, this valley was completely inaccessible to the public, and even now accessibility is very limited; allowing full, immersive enjoyment of this pristine wilderness area.

Accommodation consists of a total of 6 chalets, 4 twin rooms, 1 triple and 1 family unit.

In addition to this, the lodge also boasts 4 campsites!

We have three camp sites. Each site has its own ablution. There are structures erected to provide shade. There are no electricity or lights at these camp sites. There is however hot water at each ablution, provided by solar panels

Day 9: Naukluft Campsite NWR, Naukluft Mountain Zebra Park (Tue, 16 March)

Day Itinerary

After a relaxed breakfast we pack up camp and make our way to the Naukluft Mountains. On arrival we will setup camp and the clients have the rest of the day to explore the area on hikes and visit the natural fountains. The olive trail can be done in the afternoon or the next morning before leaving the camp. We would recommend the morning due to heat in the afternoon. All meals prepared by your guide.

Naukluft Mountain Zebra Park

Located north of the Namib Naukluft National Park, the Naukluft Mountain Zebra Park boasts a rich history, spectacular landscape, and abundant desert wildlife. The strikingly beautiful Naukluft Mountains are known for their interesting geology, as well as for their fauna, which includes leopards, Hartmann's mountain zebras, and varied birdlife. Three separate layers of rock – the oldest of which is thought to date back some 2000 million years – form steep cliffs rising to a flat plateau that can be reached via walking trails and 4x4 routes. A particular highlight of the Naukluft region is the series of freshwater pools located near the Kudusrus campsite. Visitors can enjoy exploring this magnificent Namibian landscape on various safaris.

Overnight: Naukluft Campsite NWR

The Naukluft section of the park was created to serve as a sanctuary for Hartmann's mountain zebra, which are endemic to Namibia. Other wildlife includes kudu, gemsbok, klipspringer, duiker, steenbok, leopard, baboon, black-backed jackal, bat-eared fox, African wild cat, caracal and aardwolf. Naukluft's steep cliffs are nesting grounds for various cliff-breeding bird species, including Black eagles. Five different vegetation communities within the park ensure a wealth of tree and shrub species, and a variety of aloes. Accommodation at Namib Naukluft Campsite comprises of 6 guest rooms and 21 campsites. Facilities at the camp includes a kiosk and a bar.

Day 10: Sossus Oasis Campsite, Sesriem (Wed, 17 March)

Day Itinerary

After breakfast the clients can do the Olive trail hike if not done the day before. Along the way to Sossusvlei the clients can optionally visit a local wine farm where they can do a wine tasting which is all produced right there in the desert. The Neuras farm has won awards for some of its wines as well. Upon arriving at the next camp site at Sesriem the clients will have time to setup camp and relax by the pool as the next morning will start early. All meals prepared by your guide.

Sesriem

As there is no accommodation at Sossusvlei, visitors to this desert wilderness are likely to end up staying at Sesriem, 65 kilometres away, where camps and lodges serve as a base from which to explore the dunes. Sesriem Canyon, a deep chasm carved through the rocks by water, is a striking natural feature of the area that is best explored on foot. Stony walls rise up sharply on both sides of the canyon, while birds roost in its crags and lizards dart along the ledges. The canyon's name was coined when early settlers used it as a water source, using six lengths of leather ('sesriem – six thongs) tied together to lower buckets into the water at the base of canyon.)

Camping under star-studded skies at the entrance gate to Sossusvlei

18 Individually Shaded Camp Sites, each with its own elegant toilet and shower facilities, kitchenette wash-up facility, BBQ, electricity and power outlets. Each unit has a unique roof top terrace to admire the magnificent sunset and sunrise views surrounding the camp and is a perfect spot for those eager to sleep under the star-studded skies of the Namib.

The Sossus Oasis Camp Site has a cool and inviting pool and within walking distance is a fully stocked shop. The Sossus Oasis Service Station Shop offers snacks, drinks, ice, groceries, wood, toiletries, curios, clothing as well as fuel and a tyre workshop service. The nearest restaurant is situated at the adjacent Sossusvlei Lodge. Exciting desert activities like Guided Excursions to Deadvlei and Sossusvlei, Elim dune walks, Sundowner Trips and magnificent Scenic Flights over the dunes and coast can be booked at the Sossusvlei Lodge Adventure Centre.

Treasure the ambience of the Namib Desert under star studded skies to the tune of the Barking Gecko and the far cry of a jackal.

Day 11: Sossus Oasis Campsite, Sesriem (Thu, 18 March)

Early start to head into the Sossusvlei area, your guide will advise if breakfast will be at the camp or in the park. Your guide will describe the way he wants to tackle the day but you will visit the famous Deadvlei, Big daddy dune, Dune 45, Sesriem canyon and some other hidden view points along the way. Your guide will advise where to start and end to get the maximum out of your day. Get ready to do some dune climbing and fill up those SD cards. The late afternoon will be spent at own leisure. All meals prepared by your guide.

Dead Vlei

This ancient clay pan was once an oasis, studded with acacias and fed by a river that suddenly changed course, leaving the earth to dry up along with the trees it previously supported. So dry were the climatic conditions that the trees never decomposed – instead they were entirely leached of moisture so that today, 900 years later, they remain as desiccated, blackened sentinels dotting the pan's cracked surface. Surrounded by the red-pink dunes of the Namibia Desert, they create a surreal spectacle that is a photographer's dream.



Big Daddy Dune

Big Daddy is the tallest dune in the Sossusvlei area. This magnificent dune is situated between Sossusvlei and Deadvlei and at 325 meters it dwarfs the other dunes. Should you want the ultimate bragging rights, take a lot of water and trek to the top of Big Daddy where you can look down onto Deadvlei.

At 325 meters, Big Daddy may be the highest dune in the Sossusvlei area, however it is not the highest in the Namib Desert. This honour is given to Dune 7, which has been measured at 388m. Dune 7 earned its name by being the 7th dune along the Tsauchab River.

Dune 45

Named for its location 45 kilometres past the town of Sesriem, Dune 45 is renowned for its elegant shape, which – along with its position close to the road – have earned it the distinction of 'most photographed dune in the world'. If

you're not keen for the strenuous hike to the top of Big Daddy, Dune 45 is a more forgiving alternative, standing at only 80 metres and featuring a much gentler gradient.



Sesriem Canyon

Sesriem Canyon, near the entrance of Namib-Naukluft National Park, is a striking natural gorge shaped by the Tsauchab River over millions of years. Visitors can walk through its narrow passages, admire dramatic rock formations, and enjoy the rare presence of water year-round. Notably, the canyon's name derives from early explorers who tied six leather straps together to lower buckets into the depths to fetch water, highlighting its historic significance.
